Registration for 2019-2020

Student registration is done online; not at the school. Online registration will begin on **Wednesday, January 9, 2019 at 8 a.m.** Pacific Standard Time.

The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. If your answer is yes to any of the following questions, you will register through the new online registration process:

- Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- **Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2019? (ie new Kindergarten in September)**
- Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? **Applications will be received until January 31, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2019. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.**
- Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- Do I want to register my child at Departure Bay Eco-School?
- Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz)
- Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)? **Applications are due by March 31, 2019**

Before you begin, you will need the following:

- 1) A valid email address
- 2) Photo or scan showing proof of citizenship (ie. Birth certificate)
- 3) Photo or scan showing proof of Canadian residency (ie. Mortgage or bank statement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

Guidelines for Sick Kids

“WHEN DO I KEEP MY CHILD AT HOME?”

Please keep your child at home if he or she:

- Is vomiting (2 or more times in the past 24 hours)
- Has a body rash especially with a fever or itching
- Has diarrhea (3 or more watery stools in 24 hours)
- Has an eye infection (thick mucus draining from the eye)
- Has a sore throat with a fever or swollen glands
- Has a fever of 100 degrees F. or higher AND sore throat, rash, vomiting, diarrhea, earache or is just not feeling well. Is just not feeling well (unusually tired, pale, lack of appetite, confused and cranky)

Please be sure to have back-up childcare if your child is ill. We would also ask you to remember to phone the school office (250 390-4022) if your child will not be attending.
