Registration for 2019-2020

Student registration is done online; not at the school. Online registration will begin on Wednesday, January 9, 2019 at 8 a.m. Pacific Standard Time.

The following information will help determine if this process will apply to you. If your answer is yes to any of the following questions, you will register through the new online registration process:

- o Is my child new to Nanaimo Ladysmith Public Schools?
- Do I have a child that will be turning five years old on or before December 31, 2019? (ie new Kindergarten in September)
- Do I want to register my child in Early French Immersion? Applications will be received until January 31, 2019, at which time student selection will be determined by lottery. Parents will be notified in early February 2019. Late French Immersion Students are placed as space permits.
- Do I want to register my child in Late French Immersion?
- Do I want to register my child at Departure Bay Eco-School?
- Do I want to register my child in secondary academies? (Hockey, Soccer, Beach Volleyball, Lacrosse, Baseball, Performing Arts or Jazz)
- Do I want to apply for a school transfer request (out-of-catchment)?
 Applications are due by March 31, 2019

Before you begin, you will need the following:

- 1) A valid email address
- 2) Photo or scan showing proof of citizenship (ie. Birth certificate)
- Photo or scan showing proof of Canadian residency (ie. Mortgage or bank statement, utility bill, driver's license, etc.)

Pink Shirt Day

On Wednesday, February 27 we would like to encourage students and parents to wear pink to school for Pink Shirt Day.

The word bullying tends to be used for any wrongdoing or "mean" comment. This is not the case. There can be conflict between two people without it necessarily being bullying. This does not excuse these actions, but labeling them as "bullying" when they are not waters the term down.

Students will be reminded that bullying is:

- Simply put, bullying is a <u>repeated</u> pattern of <u>unwelcome</u> or aggressive behaviour.
- Often with the goal of making others uncomfortable, scared or hurt.
- The person bullying is seeking power, control, or material things

The message for us this year is simply to Be Kind. Part of the message is letting students know that bullying is not going to be stopped by them wearing pink shirts. They have to be aware of their actions and words, and how they treat others. This means looking at how they make others feel.

Our goal is to work with students to understand the impact unkind behaviours can have on someone, while at the same time realizes the kindness then give someone can have a real positive impact.

It is important that all students recognize that they are each responsible for helping to create a safe, caring, and respectful environment at Seaview.
